- Read your writing and make sure that it makes sense.


### Rough copy

On a piece of paper, I'd like you to write a draft or a rough copy of an event from your holidays. You can have a read of what I have written to give you an idea. I'd like you to do this writing on your own, mum or dad can check your work after you have finished it. Please do not copy my writing either. If writing is something that you need a lot of time to complete, I'd like you to write a minimum of 3 sentences. Otherwise, I'd like you to write a minimum of 6 sentences. If writing is something you can do quickly, I'd like you to try to write even more.

When you are writing, I want you to think about how you can make your writing more interesting. Go back to the work you did yesterday and look at the words you used to describe your holiday experience. See if you can use some of these in your writing.

### Good copy

When you have finished your rough copy, read through it and edit or fix any mistakes you might have made in your work. Once you have done this, you can get mum or dad to correct your work. I would then like you to write out a good copy in your English practice book (medium blue or green book). If this is too much writing for you to finish in main lesson, you can complete this work as part of your English afternoon lesson for this week.
